We are well on our way to the start of another great year at Harrington School. I am pleased to welcome back all the staff and students. We begin the year with 410 students in nineteen classrooms. We have a wonderful faculty and staff at Harrington. Please join me in welcoming our newest members: Vanessa Wilson, Grade One, Karen Hall, Grade Five, Daniella Flori, Upper DLP Class Assistant, Hannah Loynd, Instructional Assistant and Tracey Gallagher, Kindergarten Assistant. Kristin Burke has joined us as our new Evaluation Team Supervisor and Julie Goff is the Physical Therapist for Harrington students.

The first priority as we begin the year is to establish routines and build a community of learners. Teachers plan many opening activities in the classroom to get to know students and build positive relationships with and among their students. These early days build the critical foundation to all our work. We are committed to continuous improvement. This year all nine schools in Lexington are focused on two major improvement goals:

1. If teachers expand their use of student data to discuss student progress and select effective instructional strategies, then all students will achieve at high levels.
2. If we increase student pro-social behavior and resiliency, and reduce sources of unhealthy student stress, then student academic performance and well-being will improve.

Harrington Community Listservs

There are two listservs for Harrington families.

- 1 **PTA listserv** – this is the official school listserv for Harrington that publishes a weekly school calendar as well as important school, PTA and town-wide emergency information.
 - This listserv operates on an "opt-out" system. All families are automatically added to this listserv system unless they fill out the "opt out" form that was distributed in the Back to School packet that was sent out during the summer. If you wish to change your e-mail address, or add another e-mail address to the system, please go the Harrington school website and fill out the list-serv form on-line.
- 2 **HAWKS listserv** – this Harrington 'Google Group' is intended to serve as an additional place for Harrington families to post or request information relevant to the community. Examples include: posting information or inquiring about kids' activities in the school (instrumental music) and outside the school (soccer, etc.); local services; notifying the group about relevant town-wide info or events; asking about events at the school; etc.
 - Information you post here is available to the member list. Currently, there are 160 members.
 - Membership is voluntary and free. *Each member submits their own information or inquiries.*
 - This group is not part of the Lexington School System and not managed by the Harrington PTA. The Harrington PTA listserv is a communication vehicle for the PTA and the school, and is not conversational - unlike the HAWKS listserv.

To join the Google Group Harrington Hawks:

- In the past, people could self-join, which also allowed SPAM or unwanted emails. In order to stop SPAM, members must be added by the host, Leslie Zales. To join, change your email address or for more information, send an email request to Leslie at leslie.zales@gmail.com. Email addresses will not be shared.

Harrington gets LEF-funded Grants

Through community support and generosity of donors, grant requests from educators that inspire innovative teaching practices, and a rigorous grant review process, the **Lexington Education Foundation (LEF)** has awarded over \$300,000 in grants and fellowships to the Lexington Public Schools for the 2010-2011 school year.

A sample of the awarded grants that directly benefit the Harrington School are: an interactive whiteboard plus training for its use; *Orchestrating Kids through the Classics*, a supplemental music appreciation program for Grade 3 students by members of the Lexington Symphony Orchestra; an opportunity for Grades 3 – 5 students to explore Lexington's history with the activities developed for *Lexington Then & Now*; kits provided to the Child Study Team that include multiple, low-tech assistive tools for classroom use; Playaways, an audio book collection for the circulation through the school library; plus several professional development opportunities for Harrington teachers.

Founded in 1989, LEF is an independent 501(c)(3) charitable organization and for over two decades has served as a conduit for community support, providing more than \$3.3 million in private funding to Lexington's nine public schools. Harrington School Council

Harrington School Council is an advisory group comprised of Harrington teachers, administration, parents, and a community representative. The Council discusses school improvement initiatives and looks at issues from multiple perspectives. Four parents serve on the Council, each serving a 2-year term. I have been a Harrington parent since 2004 when my son Daniel started Kindergarten. My husband Andy and I are now embarking on a new journey as Harrington parents as our son Matthew begins Kindergarten this year. I had the opportunity to serve as Co-P resident of the Harrington PTA for two years (2006-07 and 2007-08). Over the past six years, I have either been the Head Room Parent or Room Parent, and have worked as a volunteer in the Library, Big Back Yard, Field Day and Spring Fair. In 2004, I also began working with a district-wide PTA subcommittee, the Healthy Lunch Task Force, which recommended improvements to the school lunch program. These endeavors provided an opportunity to work with parents, teachers and staff to organize and fund programs that benefit the students at Harrington.

I believe my experience as a PTA President and member of the PTA Presidents Council will be beneficial to addressing the two major goals for school improvement. Over the past year, I have been a member of the Balance for Student Stress Committee, a town-wide group comprised of Lexington parents, educational professionals, members of the clergy and Town of Lexington employees. This committee is working to bring

programs to the high school, middle and elementary schools to increase resiliency and reduce sources of unhealthy stress for students.

I am looking forward to serving on the Harrington School Council as a representative of the parent community.

I would like to take an active role in the strategic planning & growth of our school through the opportunity to serve on the Harrington School Council. I have two children attending Harrington: Ronald in Mrs. Wilson's first grade and Elisabeth in Mrs. Roache's Kindergarten. My youngest daughter Alessandra is still in preschool at Lexington Children's Place.

My educational background is in Pharmacy/Drug Development and I am a Director of Global Patient Safety at Genzyme Corporation. I volunteer as Assistant to the Director at the Dante Alighieri Center (Cambridge) on Saturday mornings where my children take Italian language classes. I also volunteer as community liaison to Lexington Public Schools for C.A.S.IT, a managing authority for Italian enrichment programs in New England through the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. C.A.S.IT provides grant monies to the Italian program at Lexington High School. I am also a member of Lexington's Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SEPAC).

When my three children were simultaneously diagnosed with hearing loss in 2009, the lack of support in Massachusetts for families with young children with hearing loss led me to establish a statewide family network with 3 mothers from other communities.

The administration and staff have made personal and professional commitments to our children, our school & our community and the School Council must be ready to support them. It is our combined responsibility to provide each child with a *solid* educational foundation in a *safe* learning environment utilizing *strategic* vision and continuous quality improvement methods.

As a mother of three children with special needs, I believe that I bring a unique--yet complimentary--perspective and skills to the Harrington School Council.
